Roots & Tradition

Stand up! Give yourself a hand! Because of you – our community – for the last 35 years the Anchorage Folk Festival has come together when it's cold and dark outside to celebrate friends and neighbors shining on the mainstage, digging deep in front of a mic on a Folk Week stool, and just knee-to-knee together, in any random corner. And no matter the stage or the corner, its roots and tradition have always looked forward, built on the past ... together. And 2024 is no different. Our incredible musical and visual guest artists in their art combine tangible stories rooted by tradition that we hope each of you carry a piece of beyond the halls of this festival.

As I reflect on our history and consider our future, I am reminded of the Pennsylvania Dutch ethos "Pigs root forward, chickens scratch back," a "fingers-crossed optimism in the face of tough times ahead." 1 The Anchorage Folk Festival is analogous to this annual New Year's 'pork and kraut' tradition for our Alaska folk arts community. We have faced tough challenges in our 35 years, but our foundation of members. volunteers, and community sponsors has carried us through. Most recently when we couldn't join together in-person we got creative with what and how we offered and supported folk arts and music – all worthwhile but very expensive experiments. We optimistically shifted tradition, but there were many consequences. Our membership dropped by nearly half, and we lost several major sponsors. Our pool of volunteers and those willing to commit to perpetuating this festival into the future as directors also shrunk, leaving the annual production of this festival to only a few. Unfortunately, this is not sustainable, and unless community engagement increases, we will be forced to change.

So here we go Folks, let's scratch through the past, dig into our traditions, so we can root forward to our future. We know it's too late to turn back now and after 35 years we "wouldn't know how, anyway¹." But we need YOU – our community, our foundation – to come back to the Festival and re-engage as members, as volunteers, and as community sponsors. I'm optimistic, and with fingers-crossed, I know we'll be okay.

We are SO GRATEFUL for YOU. Have a great Festival!!

Jennifer Sonne is a painter living and creating in Anchorage, Alaska. She primarily paints in oils, but she also creates digital art, ink and watercolor illustrations, and murals. Her work is inspired by her adventures sea kayaking and hiking in the backcountry.

How she sees it: Alaska is a place full of astounding contrasts. The snow-covered volcanoes towering over the ocean still make me feel as though I'm visiting another planet. I love the contrast of height to depth, bright summers to dark winters, the cycle of withering and regrowth, and my proximity to all of this. My first impression was that Alaska makes you feel small in the best way possible. I was humbled to walk between glaciers and mountain sides, stare up at sheer cliffs from rocky beaches, and to gaze at a huge sky full of pink sunset clouds. This state is overflowing with inspiration, so I try to capture it in my paintings. My work is simply an homage to Alaska's natural beauty. I love creating the illusion of depth through color, line, and perspective.

The most interesting thing I've learned is that the artist never stops improving. For me and my work, this means creating pieces improved in their ability to invite the viewer into the space to see what I see in Alaska.



Silent Auction Items

Hammer Dulcimer

Donated by Steve Gordon

This Hammer Dulcimer was built by Dean Premo of Amasa, Michigan in the late 1980s. Serial # 8911 means that it was the 11th instrument built in 1989. The black cherry and sugar maple wood pieces, from Iron County, Michigan - the "U.P." - are still in excellent condition, but it needs new strings in order to stay in tune (piano wire gauge info available). Builder benefited from the generous advice of a violin maker/hammer dulcimer maker near Lansing, Michigan by the name of Will White, and deserves credit for the basic design. Builder has offered to be consulted with questions (dean.premo@white-waterassociates.com; http://www.white-waterassociates.com), and has provided a document with piano wire gauges that were used for each of the string courses, and tuning. Instrument comes with a very sturdy case, wooden stand and hammers. Local player Denise Martin is willing to provide a free "startup" lesson for the highest bidder, once the strings are replaced and can be tuned to reasonably correct pitch. She's also willing to provide consultation assistance.

The KM-160 Sunburst features a solid spruce top and solid flamed maple back and sides. The neck is one piece maple with a rosewood fingerboard and a 12th fret dovetail joint. The nut is bone and the tuners are Gotoh. The 160 series mandolins use a vintage body shape and feature a genuine Nitro-Cellulose finish that does not choke the tone out of the wood. There is a rosewood overlay on the peghead and the Kentucky script is Mother of Pearl. Comes with a hard case too!

Darren is a father, husband, small business owner, principal songwriter and lead singer for Pennsylvania, Indie-Alternative-country band, Frog Holler. Over the past 27 years, Frog Holler has released seven full length recordings and two EPs of his original songs while building a reputation as a "deliriously entertaining live act."

Emily returns to PITR as the seasoned veteran of the show. Since her debut album in 1999, Kurn has been sculpting songs with all the sharp edges and fine details of humanity. While her sense of humor is often several layers deep in her songwriting, her performances on Parlor have been 'pee your pants' funny.

Boot's life often reflects the do-right renegades of early country & western music, and his songs do the same. 

This year we are thrilled to have world famous bagpiper Nick Hudson act as Senior Adjudicator. Nick (photographed above) teaches at St. Thomas' Episcopal School and plays with their Alumni Pipe Band in Houston, Texas. Nick holds a BFA in Music Performance from Carnegie-Mellon University. His performance highlights include winning the Gold Medal at the Northern Meeting in Inverness, the Braemar Gold Medal, the London Ram's Head Snuff Mull for A-Grade Piobaireachd, among many others. Nick is a member of the EUSPBA judges panel and serves as chair of the Music Board.

Pronounced "pee-brock", piobaireachd is music specifically for the bagpipe, and is held as the highest form of bagpipe music played by soloists. Piobaireachd competitions typically have 1-3 adjudicators that assess the competitor's expression, tone, and technique. Bagpipes are finicky instruments that require a lot of advanced tuning and participants are allowed to tune on stage before beginning their performance. Bagpipe competitors across the world are assessed on their piobaireachd playing ability.

Alan Walters was an extremely skilled piper from Canada who came to teach and support bagpipes in Alaska for nearly 20 years. Walters was always extremely generous with his time, particularly with younger pipers and his instruction lives on in many pipers in the area.







Judging

All contestants will be judged by our panel of four judges. We modeled our judging methods based on established performance criteria used in banjo contests all over the country.

Our distinguished judges are: Brian DeMarcus, Jay Marvin, John Walsh, and Colin Derham with AFF guest artist I Draw Slow.

The banjo is a uniquely versatile and truly American traditional instrument, and we want to celebrate the many banjo players (and especially banjo students) out there who rarely get the credit and encouragement they deserve. We hope to attract all sorts of banjo players and new fans to celebrate the talents of Alaska's banjo virtuosos during the Anchorage Folk Festival's 13th Annual Banjo Contest. Time to dust off that banjo in the corner!

Contest

- The contest will start at 3 pm on the Amphitheater stage, PSB 166
- Order of appearance will be determined before the start of the contest, by drawing numbers.
- The emcee will introduce each contestant and the song titles.
- Each contestant will have up to five minutes to play and ideally should plan to perform two instrumental numbers within that five minutes total (eek, no singing, please!). This will be on the amphitheater stage.
- RULE: Players can have one accompanist, to play basically a rhythm part, such as guitar or string bass (not another banjo, please!). The accompanist is there for musical support, but not to play solo or duet parts or in any way overshadow the banjo contestant.

Criteria for Style categories

Execution (40 points): Timing, clarity, tone quality, being in tune, dynamics and finesse, degree of difficulty. (No, we are not going to execute any banjo players, even if tempted!)

Arrangement (40 points): Musical appeal of songs played, sense of melody, originality, subtlety, and taste (or what passes for taste, in banjo music).

Spirit (10 points): The music should have life and feeling; not be listless or dragging.

Overall impression (10 points): The general effect of the performance, including factors not otherwise mentioned above. Is the audience thrilled, or chilled?

Banjo Joke guidelines

- In the Banjo Joke category, similar criteria will be applied.
- All jokes must be G-rated, like the movies, with a one-minute time limit, and one-joke maximum.
 (Jokes will be screened by a designated AFF staffer to ensure the G rating.)
- Contestants can enter the joke category and a musical category.

Judges Deliberation and Awards

All contestants should stay together until the final results are tabulated, because there might be TIES in one or more categories that need to be resolved by a play- off. That means that those players would need to each play one more song for the judges to determine the winner.

Judges will confer to determine the winners. During that time, ALL contestants are requested to gather together on stage...we might have them all play a simple tune!

At the conclusion, winners will be announced, prizes awarded, and Certificates of Performance provided. Of course, all participants are also encouraged to become members of the Anchorage Folk Festival, and to consider volunteering too.

Special thanks to Dick Sanchis (Local Burger Man), who helped us start and support this contest, and to Cara Sanchis for continuing to support it each year. Dick Sanchis was a true Champion of Banjo Music.


